- A special storytime was held on Halloween morning. Patrons came in costume and we read stories, fractured Nursery Rhymes, and sang songs. There were also several self-guided (or take home) activities, including rolla-Halloween story, word searches, and DIY haunted houses. We had a great turn out!

• An all ages pop up Potions Apothecary was held on Saturday, October 29th. Patrons decoupaged and distressed recycled bottles before filling them with potions. This event had a good turn out and received positive feedback and requests for a similar program next year.
