- We held eclipse related programs with solar glasses giveaways during the first week of April break. Many of the programs were for 'All Ages' as we wanted to reach everyone in the community.
 - April 1st: Pick up a solar cooker s'more kit, one per family
 - All 20 kits were gone before noon.
 - April 2nd: Paint the eclipse with acrylic on canvas
 - We filled the gallery with painters and had to ask half the patrons to wait in the Children's Library until a seat opened up for them to paint. It was a fun evening with painters of all ages attending. Thank you to Briana and Jessica for help painting and drying so many canvases.
 - April 3rd: Storytime with space BINGO
 - It was great to see some of last year's story time friends that now attend preK.
 - April 4th: New scavenger hunt; constellations
 - These continue to be popular so we will continue to put up a new one every two weeks.
 - April 5th & 6th Free solar viewing glasses giveaway, while supplies last
 - All of these programs gave away glasses to attendants. We also gave 117 pairs to community businesses in addition to the daily give aways listed in the chart above.

- I reached out to Wegmans to request material donations for the solar cooker program and they donated \$83.26 to purchase all the ingredients and materials to assemble the kits. A HUGE thank you to Wegmans for their generosity.
- *One Book, OWWL Kids*, a community reading event, was back this April and this year's theme is kindness. On April 25th, we held an evening storytime at 5 pm where families heard stories centering on kindness and featuring Deborah Underhill's Finding Kindness. Each family that attended went home with a copy of the book Finding Kindness and materials to paint a kindness rock. We drew a larger crowd with this evening storytime than in the past. We will try to offer one every quarter to see if the community would like them on a regular basis and to test out the most beneficial days and times.
- We are seeing more patrons use our library as space to gather.
- Story time attendance is increasing and our regular patrons are creating connections with each other.

- Kindergarteners from PCSD are taking a field trip to the library in May.
- I worked on getting a story walk for PCSD Inclusion Fest in May and will have a table at the event.

FACILITIES/ COLLECTION

- We added several new YA graphic novels and some picture books on internet safety.
- We have a large amount of donated craft materials that we are going to use for summer reading and evening teen and adult programs.

FUTURE PLANS

- A teen craft night is planned with Mary Hotchkiss for August. Teens will use a sewing machine to create fabric bookmarks.
- Summer reading is just around the corner. We are planning on serving lunch four days a week again this year starting on July 8th and ending August 8th. I have been in contact with BOCES and Mt. Morris School, who prepare our lunches and will soon be looking for volunteers to help transport them this summer. Our calendar is almost ready to share with the public. We have hired a magician, a digital comic book artist, and a drumming performer for the summer so far.
- TAB (Teen Advisory Board) is meeting in May to help select the teen activities and movies for summer programming. They will also have an opportunity to sign up for community service hours by helping at our larger programs this summer.
