## **Building:**

Hulme's came and dug down to the base of the foundation. They found the stones were very loose in the area, so they re-parged all the stone, left it overnight to dry and then filled in the hole. They do still need to return once the dirt has settled to regrade and plant grass seed.

When I was trying to let them into the building, I discovered that the side door handle was no longer working, so I called a locksmith. He came out and was able to fix the lock (just needed oiling). He also noted that both the doors on the emergency exit are residential grade rather than commercial.

There was an issue with the old pole near the ramp that had been capped. It appeared to have been mowed over and damaged. The lawn service replaced the cap.

Nick Stefaniak came and cleaned the gutters, no issues to report.

I got a quote to do deep clean the carpets, but have not executed yet because the carpets aren't as bad as in the past due to a warmer winter and less salt.

#### Miscellaneous:

I presented the budget to Rotary on May 2<sup>nd</sup> and it went very well.

Absentee ballots were sent out for the vote. I also confirmed the election inspectors & the notary for June 4th.

I received notice that the library will be receiving Bullet Aid from Assemblymember Marjorie Burns' office, sometime before the end of the year.

I was asked to be on a system ad-hoc committee to help formulate a plan to assist libraries with receiving PILOT payments.

I answered 6 reference questions and used 11 hours of PTO.

### Addendum:

- 1. Harding Plumbing and Heating came to fix the outside faucet because it was leaking in 2 places.
- 2. It came to my attention there is an issue with how our health stipend is being reported to New York State Retirement, namely that it should not be counted as pensionable. I have been taking the necessary steps to first, prevent further issues from happening and second, to rectify the issues that have occurred.
- 3. The AFR was filed before the end of the extension period; it has already been reviewed by OSC & approved with minor corrections.
