This class is a part of our Adventures in Art series made possible from the Statewide Regrant through the Arts Council of Wyoming County. I hope to apply for another Arts Council grant in the spring to fund the Hooked-on Covers Books Club that is debuting in January.
- We made gnomes from wooden spoons at our Crafternoon program on November 21<sup>st</sup>. Our young patrons were *thrilled* to use the hot glue gun on their projects, so we are going to look at getting a few low temperature ones, as well as more finger guards, so they can craft more independently with a reduced the risk of burns. Crafternoons may morph into a maker space program in 2025 as the attendance so far has been low.

#### OUTREACH

- We passed out candy on Halloween at the downtown event, greeting nearly 200 people. Three TAB volunteers came out to help pass out candy. The weather was beautiful, making a fabulous night to be out in the community. This is an event we will continue to participate in again next year.
