- Storytime was on a hiatus in January, and will resume on Wednesday, February 5th at 11:30 am.
- New York State's youth and teen annual report programming statistics have been calculated and submitted to the director.

OUTREACH

- OWWL's 3rd annual mock Caldecott awards program took place this January. I changed how the program ran a little bit this year and I am happy to announce that it went over very well with other OWWL youth services providers and, we predicted a few of the winners. Two of the upcoming scavenger hunts will feature new children's picture books that were published in 2024.
- I am scheduled to read to the students at our local Head Start Program in February and March.
- We will once again participate in OWWL's One Book, OWWL Kids. Classroom visits will hopefully occur in March and April. An interest email to area schools will go out in February.

FACILITIES/ COLLECTION

- We already had in our collection many of the books that were awarded ALA literary medals and will order the ones we do not already own in February.
- Pending approval and funding, we have an opportunity to have a local artist paint a mural in the Teen Room. Images and dates are being discussed, but we are looking at having a comic book/anime inspired sea serpent drawn on the top of the empty wall in the Teen Room sometime in April 2025. After the image is on wall, an instructional class will be held for teens interested in helping to paint the mural. For several weeks following, teens will come into the library to help paint. Registration and attendance at the instructional class will be require to help paint. As details are worked out, I will provide updates. We will be working with Learning for Arts WNY and a local artist to make this a possibility.
