FUTURE PLANS

- It's all about Summer Reading! We have great programs planned for all ages this summer. - Free lunches, for those 18 years or younger, will be served at the library every Monday through Thursday at noon from July 7th until August 7th. Thank you so much to the Mt. Morris School Cafeteria staff for coordinating the program and packing the lunches. Another big thank you to the volunteers from our local Rotary Club for picking them up in Mt. Morris and delivering them to us daily. We couldn't do it without you!

- Weekly in-house scavenger hunts will begin every Monday in July.
- Storytime will resume at 11:30 AM on July 1st and will continue weekly through August 5th.
- On Wednesday 7/9, patrons can make a key chain fidget with beads and on the 23rd, they can paint a colorful dandelion puff. Basic rainbow colors will be provided, and patrons can also select their own palette.
- On Wednesday 7/16, Dan Butler will be at the library drawing caricatures of patrons that they can then color (if they want) in the Gallery using colored pencils. Patrons can reserve their caricature sitting time on our calendar and we will have additional creative coloring activities in the Children's Room.
- On Thursdays, we will show movies in the Gallery paired with themed activities. For example, on 7/17, teens are invited to come watch and sing along with *Wicked* (2025) and make pink or green beaded keychains.
- Summer Reading's grand finale this year will be a live reptile show put on by Repco Wildlife Educators on Monday, July 28th at 1:30.
- Summer Reading Registration began on June 30th and will continue all summer. This year our registration prize is a multi-color pen, a highly coveted item from 1985 that still brings joy to kids and adults alike!
- We will again this summer reward weekly those that read and turned in their tracking slips, and those that come to the library for a program, by entering their name into a weekly drawing for either a cupcake or gelato from Old Souls. At the end of summer, all tracking and participation slips will be put into a grand prize drawing for gift certificates to local businesses or a Children's Night Out at the Charcoal Corral complete with drive-in and mini golf passes.
